www.campion.com.au and your delivery will arrive after the week commencing 15 January 2018 **OR** Drop your order into the Campion Box in the front office – no cash or cheques, just supply your credit card details.

This year Maths for Years 7 to 12 will be taught using a Mathspace e-Book only – no other text required. Order online through Campion asap to access for the start of Term 1. Access will be available from both school and home.

All students will need to purchase a supply of personal items such as a ruler, pens, files and lined paper.

Arrangements have been made through Campion to stock books and personal items applicable to courses offered at Southern River College. Please liaise directly with Campion if you wish to have the booklist and stationery delivered to your house. For this to occur you must order and pay online by 8. December 2017 via www.campion.com.au. Your delivery will arrive after the week commencing 15 January 2018 if not before. Online orders received after 9 December 2017 will incur a late fee of around \$17.50 and a later delivery date.

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME – MUST BE CLAIMED EACH YEAR FOR STUDENTS IN YEARS 7 TO 12.

The Secondary Assistance Scheme (now known as the Educational Program Allowance) consists of \$350 – made up of \$235 towards College contributions and charges and \$115 clothing allowance. Application forms are available from the College and must be completed before Friday 13 April 2018. Assistance to complete these forms is always available from the front office staff.

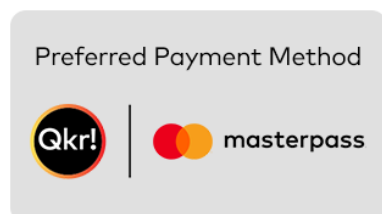
- The card held must be current sometime in the first term (31 January – 13 April 2018).
- Students must be enrolled in Years 7 – 12 studying a full-time secondary course. Allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

ABSTUDY & ABSTUDY SUPPLEMENT ALLOWANCE – MUST BE CLAIMED EACH YEAR

Parents/students in receipt of \$157 payment of ABSTUDY through Centrelink (**Commonwealth Aboriginal Secondary Grants Scheme**) are not eligible for the Secondary Assistance Scheme allowance, but can apply for \$79 through the College to receive the ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance to meet the full claim of \$235.

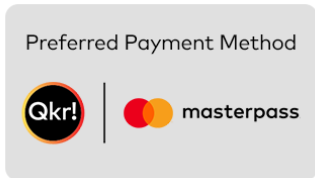
PAYMENT PLANS

YOUR CHILD'S SUBJECT COSTS EXPLAINED

Charges and Voluntary Contributions

Subjects and their associated costs are specified in the attached invoice and relate to the Timetable as per your child's selection done in 2017. Payment of subject costs ensures sufficient resources, photocopying and other items essential to curriculum delivery are provided for your child. Every endeavour has been made to keep the charges for each subject to a minimum.

Years 7 to 10

- **Voluntary Contributions**

These funds relate to monies requested of parents to put towards the cost of subject materials, services and facilities used by the students in the educational program. Depending upon your child's choice of subjects, the voluntary contribution may total \$235.00.

- **Compulsory Charges**

These monies are compulsory. They relate to optional activities chosen by the student and parent that may also include high cost components: **Participation in these components is voluntary, but a charge is payable if the student selects a subject with extra cost optional charges.**

Years 11 and 12 - Compulsory Charges apply to ALL courses in Years 11 and 12.

Voluntary Approved Requests

Information Technology Priority.....\$15.00

Covers the cost of providing IT resources and materials for laptops and computers in classrooms and to purchase IT resources and equipment.

Parents and Citizens Association\$15.00

The P&C Association supports the students of Southern River College in a variety of ways including managing the Canteen and assisting with fundraising events. The P&C also supports the Student Council and the Graduation awards for Year 12 students and holds fundraising events during the year. The P&C invites parents/guardians to attend meetings and to become a member. Meetings are held on Wednesday night midway during each term between 7.00-8:30pm (the specific dates are advertised on the College sign and newsletters).

Chaplaincy\$15.00

Our college Chaplain is not an employee of the Department of Education and is funded by the College, our community and parent donations. The Chaplain's role in the College has been invaluable and the programs that have been implemented have benefited all students. Your donations make a difference.

Other Optional Costs

Year Book \$20.00

This is an annual publication (including photographic records) celebrating the events and activities of students within the College community. Full payment required by the end of Term 3.

Homework & Events Diary \$8.00

Can be obtained at the College. The Diary will assist your child to organise times and is a means of communication with parents/guardians.

Reports & Student Services \$10.00

Covers the cost of providing all services relating to newsletters, reports and the documentation / support provided to students by the student services team.

Possible Extra Costs

PaperCut Printings \$5.00/\$10.00

To meet the cost of paper and toner cartridges used for classroom printers. Students will be allocated \$5.00 worth of free printing credits at the start of each term to provide enough printing for the average student all year. However, should this free credit be fully used, the student will be required to pay \$5.00 for another block of credits. Students studying ICT subjects will be provided with \$10.00 free credits at the commencement of each term to meet the higher volume of printing expected in that subject. Students will not be able to access the printer if these extra credits are not purchased once the free allocation has been used.

Smarrider Cards.....\$5.00

The College will issue the student's initial Smart rider card for travel on TransPerth buses upon request (free). In the case of loss/damaged cards students need to apply for a replacement card. Requests are made through the Student Services reception desk.

OTHER INFORMATION

Uniforms

The Principal has exercised the right under the Occupation, Health and Safety Act to make the uniform compulsory. This decision is endorsed by the School Board made up of staff, parents and community members. As part of their learning environment it is very important that all students are dressed appropriately so that they can be easily identified and as a safety factor against intruders. Due to Occupational Health and Safety all students must wear closed in shoes, eg. runners, black lace ups etc. No thongs, slip-ons or open toes.

In order to keep the uniform streamlined all garments will only be available through our Uniform Shop which is open every Tuesday and Friday morning from 8:00 to 10:30 am during the year, as well as additional times at the start of the year as detailed on the front cover. Bus Routes

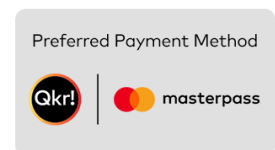
Public bus routes that service the College – 211, 231 and 232. Bus service 517 runs between Murdoch Train Station and the College on Southern River Road. Bus service 518 runs from Piara Waters to link with bus 517 at either Livingston Shopping Centre (recommended) or at the junction of Ranford and Campbell Roads, Gosnells.

Insurance

The College takes no responsibility for the theft, damage or loss of any personal items. There is no Department of Education policy to cover theft of phones, bikes etc. Student's health insurance will need to be covered by either Medicare or parent/guardian's private insurance.

Excursion Payments

Try downloading Qkr! onto your mobile to make payments easy. Visit southernrivercollege.wa.edu.au for download instructions.



If not using Qkr!, excursion payments can be made and receipted by the Front Office using one of the following methods.

- Students attending excursions/events will be issued with an information letter and permission form which is to be completed and returned along with payment for the event.
- Payment can be made by cheque, Visa or Mastercard or cash (correct money only).
- A Money Collection envelope may also be provided, otherwise students can place payment into the envelopes provided at the Front Office and place them into the Payment Box.
- We do not accept responsibility for discrepancies with cash, or lost cash, and we do not accept American Express.
- **Payment envelopes should not be left on the counter.**

N.B. It is extremely important that you make payment by the due date prior to the excursion. This is due to the record management and processing required by administration to meet the excursion policy guidelines to enable your student to attend an excursion/event. Therefore students who have not paid by the due date may not be permitted to attend the excursion/event.

If the child is not able to attend the event the money cannot be refunded, unless stated otherwise in the excursion information sheet, as there is no refund to the College from the organisation running the event.
